Position Overview

The Daycare specialist takes responsibility for the wellbeing and needs of children under their care. This position will report to and work with the Philmont Training Center management to run, maintain, and devlope a curriculum. Position is a Monday – Friday 7:30 am to 5:50pm with Holidays off.

Primary Duties & Responsibilities

- Ability to work independently and give leadership to the Philmont Training Center Staff rotating through Small Fry duties.
- Collaberate with staff and supervisor to delvelop and implement a early childhood curiculm.
- Create a daily schedule for children and staff to follow while attending Small Fry.
- Maintain contact and communicate effectively with children's parents.
- Stay with children during meal times.
- Prepeare snacks and other foods to supplement dietary needs at meal times.
- Create a weekly commissary order for food and supplies.
- Provide ongoing training during the season to new staff working in Small Fry as needed.
- Pay close attention to health, safety, welfare, attitude, and morale of the children. Take immediate action to solve problems.
- Write an end of the season report including inventories, evaluations, schedules, and other documents necessary to future Philmont Training Center programs.
- Supervise the use of Philmont Training Center equipment and facilities related to safety and programs.

- Clean and maintain Small Fry during the day. Alert Management for maintence and restock needs.
- Working hours are 7:30am-5:30pm Monday-Friday. BSA Holidays off.
- Requests off must be made a week in advance unless for an emergency.
- Assist with other staff responsibilities as directed by the Philmont Training Center management to ensure that the mission of Philmont Training Center and Philmont is carried out.
- Provide and maintain a cheerful, helpful, and efficient service to all Philmont guests. Insure that all participants have an enjoyable experience. When possible, solve their needs and concerns, when not possible, steer them to someone who can.
- Complete other duties as assigned by direct supervisor or ranch management as required

Desired Qualifications & Experience

- Ability to prioritize tasks and ask for help when needed
- Ability to function well in a high-pace and at times stressful environment
- Previous experience with young children is required.
- Ability to work independently and give leadership to the Philmont Training Center Small Fry Center.
- Must complete assigned New Mexico Food Handler Safety Course prior to arrival; instructions for course completion will be sent in your staff packet

Physical Requirements & Work Environment

- Must meet the BSA height/weight requirements
- Be able to lift and handle materials up to 50 pounds throughout the scheduled workday
- Up to 90% of the workday could be spent standing, walking, bending, stooping, kneeling, or crouching
