Duty To God Pilgrimage

Scouts and Scouters of all Christian faiths are encouraged to participate in our 2024 Duty To God Pilgrimage program offered at the Philmont Training Center July 21-July 26, 2024. Since we will also have our Scouting Brothers from the Scouts of Japan visiting with us, all participants, both Scout and Scouter, will have the opportunity to earn 2-4 International Scouting Medals and Activity Patches. Our Pilgrimage will explore lives of Saints, their Faith Journeys and how it relates to our own Faith Journey today, visit the "miraculous staircase" at Loretto Chapel in Santa Fe, marvel at the 200 year old cross at the Church at Chimayo and explore the Indian Cliff Dwellings at the Bandolier National Monument. Scouts 12 years (if 12, then one parent needs to attend) and older are welcome to participate as long as they have attended one summer camp and achieved First Class Rank, are in good standing within their Troop and Church, wish to become closer to their faith, Philmont Physical required, and follow our Scouting Code of Conduct. All participating Scouters have the ability to earn the Scouting International Religious Knot and several other patches that our Scouts earn during our trip.

A. Objective – Our Pilgrimage program, which was awarded the 2008 National "Award of Excellence," will be in its 7th iteration using volunteers from around the Dallas, Ft Worth area who are dedicated to its success. Methodist, Episcopal, Lutheran, Non-Denominational and Catholic Scouts have already participated in this pilgrimage. SR Area 2 has requested our program be limited to the Christian religious awards as there were concerns we would be overwhelmed taking on all potential faiths.

E. Pilgrimage Destination Descriptions

Loretto Chapel. Begun in 1873, the Loretto church marked its beginnings when the Bishop Jean Baptisite Lamy put out the call for priests, brothers and nuns to come to the new territory to teach. The Loretto Church is most famous for its mysterious spiral staircase, built sometime between 1877 and 1881. It makes two 360-degree turns, stands twenty feet tall and has no center support. It rests solely on its base and against the choir loft. The risers of the 33 steps are all of the same height. It's made of wood that is an apparently extinct species. The staircase was constructed with only square wooden pegs without glue or nails. The staircase is still a mystery to architects, engineers and master craftsmen and was considered a miracle. In the late 1960s, the Sisters sold the Chapel and it is no longer used as a functioning church. The historic value of its museums, churches and adobe structures is immense. It's spiritual value is immeasurable. When you enter, don't be surprised to hear German, French, Japanese, etc.

Philmont Scout Ranch. We are participating in an official Philmont Training Center program. However, we will mingle with Scouts going on Philmont Treks while we visit various sites at base camp. As participants at the Training Center, we will have the opportunity to brand our boots, make a leather Philmont belt, etc. We will meet Scouting families from around the country participating in other programs. We will also plan a surprise

Bandolier National Monument (Indian Cliff dwellings) **The Frijoles Canyon was a place where ancient peoples lived. They were Pueblo people who farmed and hunted. They inhabited the Bandolier area for some 500 years before 1600 A.D. These had a large number of rooms; one with 40 rooms has been discovered. They also lived in rooms carved out of the hillsides.** And then they were gone San Miguel Mission. The oldest existing church in North America was built during 1610. The Tlaxcala Indians built the mission, the Christian Brothers use it as a school chapel and Archbishop Jean Lamy established a Santa Fe congregation. The most unbelievable part of this visit is that they still let you RING THE BELL! Descriptions of other destinations will take place in future meetings.

F. Equipment: We have a specific Equipment List for Scouts and Scouters so we can fit everything in our vehicles.

G. Behavior/Discipline.

We will operate under the same exact same "Code of Conduct" policy as Philmont Scout Ranch Or the National Scout Jamboree.

We are representing both the Church and Scouts BSA so all Scouts and Scouters should be on their best behavior. As I will reiterate during our preparatory meetings leading up to the 2024 Pilgrimage, we expect good behavior. See Application At Bottom
