TREKKING THE PHILMONT WAY.

A Philmont trek is a backpacking expedition where Scouts lead themselves through new challenges within New Mexico's rocky mountain backcountry. With over 140,000 acres and 30+ staffed camps to explore, a trek at Philmont is Scouting's pinnacle high adventure experience.

On their trek, Scouts will visit staffed camps planted throughout Philmont's wilderness, each with their own unique offering of adventure programs, western culture, and living history.

The methods for backpacking and camping at Philmont are catered to develop the youth leaders of your crew. Philmont provides all crew equipment needed to complete a trek, leaving only Scouts' personal items that need to make the journey with your crew to New Mexico.

Philmont employs over 1,000 staff members to ensure each trek is a smooth, safe, and memorable experience. This includes trained program staff, medical personnel, and logistics operators, all working together as an invisible safety net



SO, HOW DOES THIS PHILMONT THING WORK?

- OPEN TO SCOUTS AGES 13+ and have completed the 8th grade. (or 14)
 - ALSO OPEN TO SCOUTS AGES 18-20 (as adult program participants)
- **CREWS are made up of 8-12 participants**, including a minimum of <u>THREE</u> Adult Leaders (21+) for safety and supervision.
- TREKS RANGE IN LENGTH FROM 7 DAYS TO 12 DAYS.
 Crews select their top three itinerary choices that fit their goals, ranging from program-heavy to high-milage itineraries.
- THE CREW METHOD: Crews select youth for leadership roles, such as Crew Leader, Wilderness Pledge Guide, & Chaplin's Aide.
- SERVICE & IMPACT: Crews complete a conservation project during their trek, leaving a positive impact on Philmont's land.
 Additionally, crews learn the importance of caring for the land and contribute to a stronger future for the next generation of Scouts.

WHY HIGH ADVENTURE?

Philmont's national high adventure program pushes Scouts beyond their comfort zones, fostering additional growth. Research shows that Scouts who participate in national high adventure programs like Philmont develop further in areas such as:

- Communication
- Leadership skills
- Goal-oriented mindset
- Purpose beyond themselves
- Higher-level leadership
